Gate Way to the year 2022-2023



The year 2022-23 is a year of many challenges at the macro and micro level which includes population explosion, poverty, unemployment, and violence against children and women. SINAM NGO has entered into the 38th year of memorable services to the poor and needy people. SINAM NGO was formally registered and started its services on May 16, 1986 in Sadayanodai Village. SINAM NGO is a fully qualified, equipped NGO, functionally and legally an active NGO with its transparency in operation and accountability of services. SINAM has obtained 12AA, 80G, TAN, PAN, NGO Darpan Registration, FCRA renewal and CSR registration. SINAM NGO has gone through the different stages of grass root level NGO to medium size NGO with the contribution of International Donors, National Donors, Government Grants, Local Sponsors / Donors and Community Contribution.

The bird's eye view is given to each activities carried out during the financial year 2022 April – 2023 March. It is possible to achieve the results with the full participation of various stake holders including government partners, international / national partners, NGO partners, community partners, board members, media group, staff, volunteers and the different resource personnel participated in the diversified activities.

Protection and promotion of environment and eco-system of Tiruvannamalai.

This project was implemented in 10 villages in Tiruvannamalai District. In each selected village, a separate forest protection committee was formed. Totally, there were 138 members in all 10 forest protection committees. Each forest protection committee consists of elected representative of PRI, women self help group members, youth club members, local farmers and nature conservation volunteers (Environmentalists). Capacity development training was given to forest protection committee members.



The project components included the following.

Awareness campaign was organized in 10 villages, covering the information dissemination on developing tree plantation, protection and development of Bio-diversity, causes of global warming and climate change, need for nature conservation, bio-diversity and environment security.

Nursery was developed at SINAM Development centre campus with the help of self-help group members and local volunteers.

Identified and selected sites for planting 1500 saplings in each village. The area for tree plantation covered individual land sites, water bodies, panchayat lands, village common lands, temple lands, village forest lands, village road side, Government extrovert lands, hill station land and agro forest land.

Sapling was distributed on 13.02.2023 in the presence of Government ICDS officials.

 $15000 (1500 \times 10 \text{ villages})$ saplings were distributed to the community. 10000 leaflets / hand outs was prepared, printed and circulated on bio- diversity, conservation of nature and environment security.

The trained volunteers were actively involved in each village. Around 500 volunteers were involved in planting 15000 saplings in all 10 villages (50 volunteers x 30 saplings x 10 villages = 15000)

This project had a following impact

Village volunteers and forest protection committee members were trained.

Inventory was made with the long list of native endangered trees.

Planted trees for bio-diversity and nature conservation.

Promotion of safe environment and environment security.

Programs for widowes living with HIV/AIDS.



HIV / AIDS is a challenging sexually transmitted disease mostly affected to the marginalized groups/migrants. The increased number of HIV / AIDS in Tiruvannamalai district is directly associated with the heavy seasonal migration of people from different States and Countries. The cross cultural migration in the context of Girivalam, Deepam and pilgrimage to the famous Shiva temple in Tiruvannamalai may be the root cause for increased HIV/AIDS infection. In this connection, an awareness intervention programme was held at Government primary health centre, Tiruvannamalai on 21.04.2022. Totally 65 target people participated in the programme. Welfare benefits distributor to the poor and marginalized widows living with HIV / AIDS.



Totally, 150 dalit poor children are benefited out of this evening supplementary education programme. Every day, two hours in the evening was spent by the qualified teachers to supplement the school education subjects towards the improvement in cognitive domain (knowledge), affective domain (attitude) and psycho motor domain (skill) covering over all subjects like language (Tamil & English), Mathematics, Science, History and Civis. The children with this additional input in the evening supplementary education centre were able to score more marks in the subjects and they gained confidence in their studies. There were no school drop outs, no child marriage and no child labour in all selected 5 villages where the project intervened. The children garden 13th year celebration was held with the distribution of education materials on 05.03.2022. The following guests of honours participated in the event.

Construction of Sanitary Toilets for Irular Tribal Community.



Construction of sanitary toilet project was implemented for the Irular Tribal community (primitive Non-hills tribe) at Kilvanakkampadi Irular colony of Thandrampet Block in Tiruvannamalai District. The following are the project activities carried out by the end of March 2023. The project will be completed in September 2023.

65 beneficiaries are identified and selected

Project orientation training was given and prepared for their participation in the project in the form of manual assistance to builders and skilled workers.

Project implementation committee was formed with 10 members including the Director of SINAM, Project co-ordinator, President of Kilvanakkampadi panchayat, President of Irular Community Association and six project beneficiaries.

Project orientation training was given to the project implementation committee.

Boomi pooja (ground breaking ceremony) was conducted Earth work excavation was carried out by the beneficiaries as part of their contribution.

Foundation work was completed to all 65 beneficiaries.

SINAM NGO has carried out the training service, monitoring service, provided supervision, technical control over the construction through the qualified engineer and quality control of the construction of toilets.

The sanitary toilet construction project is supported by SELAVIP, Chile





Family Counselling Programme

Family Counselling Programme funded by Central Social Welfare Board has been in operation in SINAM NGO for the last 15 years. A subcommittee formed with the following members has been providing advisory services and monitoring services to the family counseling programme. The various activities of the following types are implemented and co-ordinated by SINAM NGO.

During the reporting period, 304 women benefited, (New cases) pending cases of the previous year, followed up during this year was 36. The women had the following types of problems.

- Dowry harassment
- Marital Maladjustment with spouse and in laws
- Maladjustment due to personality difference
- Extra marital relationship
- Alcohol / drug addiction
- Economic crisis
- Domestic violence
- Depression
- Mental and physical torture
- Property / legal inheritance problem
- Marital separation etc.



The subcommittee used to meet once in 3 months and established linkages with other Governmental institutions for legal / administrative remedies for the affected women. The programme has been linked with women police stations, courts, legal institutions and revenue departments. 5000 copies of I.E.C. materials were printed and circulated at Bus stand and in other places. Further, it was exposed through digital banner, local TV channels, newspapers etc., public awareness on women issues was generated.

HIV / AIDS Target Intervention Programme

This project has been supported by Tamil Nadu AIDS Control Society (TANSACS), Chennai.



Target intervention is primarily focused on the following category of people.

a) MSM - 550

b) FSW - 650

c) TG - 50

The project team consists of the Project Director, Project Manager, M & E Cum Accounts Officer, Counselor, Outreach Workers and PEER Educators.

District Information Centre (DIC) was developed close to Tiruvannamalai central bus stand. Information was disseminated to all those who visited the centre. The visiting people are the high-risk groups, target groups and those who are interested on the issue including the social activists. Counselling was provided to the sex workers on the safe sex including the use of condom and the use of lubricating substance. Advocacy activities were carried out to protect the human rights and to settle the legal / health issues by utilizing the Government Institutions.



Voluntary testing of HIV/AIDS, counseling and follow up services were carried out and integrated them with government health care services. Community awareness programmes were organized in different strategic places for the prevention and control of HIV / AIDS. Among the target beneficiaries 18 persons were selected and trained them on PEER Education. They disseminate the information about the causes and consequences of HIV/AIDS, preventive methods of HIV infection, voluntary testing / counseling, treatment procedures and possible rehabilitative measures, community based screening was also carried out.

The target group can easily walk into the office situated close to the bus stand and obtain the need based services from the project office.

The target intervention programme covered the following six blocks in Tiruvannamalai District.

- 1. Tiruvannamalai
- 2. Thandrampattu
- 3. Chengam
- 4. Pudupalayam
- 5. Thurinjapuram
- 6. Kilpennathur.



The project has been facilitating and carrying out the following services.

Availability of various contraceptives and distribution outlets.

Voluntary testing for the suspected HIV / victims.

Facilitation of protected sex

Information dissemination on sexual diseases caused by unprotected sex

ABC / Abstinence, being faithful to the partners and condom use for the prevention of HIV / AIDS.

Elimination of Social stigma and isolation caused by HIV / AIDS for the formation of inclusive society.

Early diagnosis and treatment

Facilitation of medical services at Government Hospital

Need based / community based rehabilitative services.

Due to various services carried out by SINAM, the HIV / AIDS victims are accepted in the society and integrated with other stake holders.



Anganvadi Day and Angavadi Seervarisai Celebration

Anganvadi Day and Angavadi Seervarisai Celebration was jointly organized by SINAM NGO and Tiruvannamalai District ICDS project. This programme was funded by T.N. FORCES.



Angavadies in Tiruvannamalai District are not having adequate infrastructure like play materials, reading materials, weighing machine, teaching / learning materials, sleeping mats, toilet materials etc. In this context, the above materials were provided by SINAM in 5 Balwadies in Tiruvannamalai Block and Thurinjapuram Block. Income Generation Activities



Income Generation Program Loan was provided by Reshtriya Mahila Kosh (RMK) to 32 women from Tiruvannamalai Block and Thurinjapuram Block. This loan was used by the women for starting income generation activities like Idly flour grinding machine, vegetable shop, vendor of milk and milk products, petty shop, saree sale flower shop etc. The women received sizable income for their sustainable livelihood. The women successfully repaid the entire loan amount. 100% loan recovery was achieved

NIRANTHARA Programme

Under NIRANTHARA Programme, staff capacity development and NGO capacity development programme was carried out under NIRANTHARA-2 Programme. The CFM and FRM personnel were trained. Two SINAM Staffs went to Bangalore for the training and all SINAM staff members were trained at SINAM centre. The staff development training was hosted by Dhwani Foundation Bangalore.



Focus Group Discussion among Migrant women / adolescent girls

Focus Group Discussions (FGDs) was conducted in 16 villages, representing 4 Blocks in Tiruvannamalai district viz. Thurinjapuram, Kilpennathur, Thiruvannamalai and Thandrampet. The villages were selected on random basis. 4 FGDs were conducted on different four categories.



The FGDs Participants details are listed below:

- 1. Community members, local stakeholders like ASHA Workers, Self Help Group leaders, Youth group leaders and Members of Trade Union.
- 2. School Teachers and Head Masters.
- 3. Girls / Young Women discontinued work / returned from Textile Industry / Supply Chain
- 4. Panchayat representatives like President, Vice president, Councilors and elected Ward Members. In each FGD, 6 to 12 members participated.

In view of the problem analysis carried out in different dimensions, the following are the areas of project interventions in course of time.

- Awareness education to girl children and their parents on the importance of education.
- Educational guidance, vocational guidance and personal guidance and counseling.
- Career guidance.
- Life skill and life coping skill training.
- Legal awareness / education on the rights of women.
- Laws against child labour and child abuse.
- Financial literacy.
- Women entrepreneurial development.
- Skill training for self employment / paid employment (computer, tailoring, Garments units catering technology, handicrafts work training, house wiring, home appliance, electrical, home care management and agricultural allied activities. etc.,)
- Family formation training.
- Laws protecting the rights of women and children.
- Government schemes for sustainable livelihood programmes.
- Livestock development training.

Poverty reduction and livelihood development has been the focus areas of our intervention.





Computer and Tailoring Skill training programme

30 young women including People with Disabilities, young widows, single women and Deserted women participated in 6 months Job oriented skill training in computer and Tailoring. All 30 women received paid employment/self employment and were earning for their sustainable livelihood.



International Women's day programme

SINAM NGO has been organizing international women's day programme every year. During this reporting year, women's day programme was held on 15-03-2023 at SINAM Development centre on the theme "Accelerating equality and empowerment". The equality is not given to women and they are required to face lot of challenges in their empowerment process. In this context, one day training was organized for the women leaders of Tiruvannamalai District 100 women leaders participated in the training.



World Against Child Labour Awareness meeting

The World Against children Labour awareness meeting was held on 21-6-2022 at Government Boys Higher Secondary School Thanipadi. 200 Students participated in the meeting. The child labour meeting was focused on the prevention of child labour, compulsory education, prevention of child marriage. Child labour is an offence, punishable under government act.


















Thanks & Gratitude
